At the time we went to press, our first “Steak Shoot” night of the season had not been held, so we’ll have to let you know next month who the winners were for April.

But what we can tell you is that a new pricing structure will be in effect with the May “Steak Shoot” games. Because the price of beef has increased significantly, as most of you already know, we found it necessary to raise the cost of our games.

Beginning in May, one “rack of 3 cards” will be \$10. You can play the entire night with this one rack, and that includes 24 regular games and the bonus games. But for \$20, you will get not two, but THREE cards! Since many people buy more than one rack of cards each month, this may end up saving them some money, and we will still cover our costs too. For instance, if someone usually buys three racks of cards at \$8 each, their total cost would be \$24. With the new pricing, three racks will cost \$20, a savings of \$4.

You do not have to buy two or more cards to play “Steak Shoot” – one rack at \$10 is all you need to win! So please join us for these fun nights, and with the beautiful weather we’re anticipating, it’s going to be grilling time!

As we welcome a new month, I offer some springtime reading suggestions.

Nora Roberts has millions of fans of her romantic suspense novels. Her latest series is the Guardians Trilogy, a paranormal romance that takes her readers to exotic locales, including the island of Corfu in Greece, Capri and Ireland in search of the stars of fire, water and ice. The six seekers battle a dangerous source of evil to find the stars. The series consists of *Stars of Fortune*, *Bay of Sighs*, and *Island of Glass*.

Author Lisa Carey offers her new book *The Stolen Child: A Novel*. On St. Brigid’s Island off the western coast of County Clare, an American woman seeks St. Brigid’s Well where the spring water is rumored to have special healing powers and performs miracles. It’s May 1959 and the island’s inhabitants live an isolated life without electricity. The American claims her inheritance of her uncle’s cottage there, but she seeks more. What she encounters is superstition, betrayal and the magic of Irish lore.

Saints for All Occasions: A Novel by bestselling author J. Courtney Sullivan tells the story of two sisters in the 1950s who leave their small village in Ireland for America. Nora and Theresa head in different directions as the older one marries and raises a large Catholic family and the younger one becomes a cloistered nun. A sudden death forces them together to face a secret they share.

The English Daughter by Maggie Wadey is a memoir about a woman trying to discover who her mother really was. Wadey’s mother, Agnes Kavanagh, left County Tipperary for England and married an Englishman. Not until her final years did Agnes finally tell her daughter the story of her childhood in Ireland. The author had always felt that her mother was different and suspected that it was because of her Irishness. After Agnes’ death, Wadey travels to Ireland to connect with her mother’s past.

The town renovates one of its mansions into


