






The new month brings some good reading choices that I hope you will enjoy.

Days Without End: A Novel by Sebastian Barry is the love story of Irish immigrants John Cole and Thomas McNulty as they travel through the United States. In this historical novel, they join the army and fight Indians out West, join the Union Army during the Civil War, spend time in Andersonville Prison Camp, and informally adopt an Indian daughter. Barry draws pictures in words of the beautiful American landscape against the carnage of war.

Lydia Peelle's debut novel *The Midnight Cool: A Novel* is the story of an Irish immigrant, Billy Monday, and his young friend, Charles McLaughlin. They are grifters in Tennessee who are selling mules to the British Expeditionary Force in 1916. The con men are swindled themselves when they buy a killer horse named Midnight Cool that cannot be tamed. Of course, there is a love story with Charlie falling in love with the beautiful daughter of the landowner who sold them the horse.

In *Nine Folds Make a Paper Swan*, author Ruth Gilligan ties together three stories from three different time periods to tell the story of the Jewish community in Ireland. The first is the story of a Lithuanian family bound for the United States in the early 1900s, but they land in Ireland instead. The second relates the story of a traumatized mute boy in a mental institution in 1958 who befriends his roommate, a Jewish war hero. The third story takes place in present day as a young journalist who wants to marry her Jewish boyfriend must consider his ultimatum: first she must convert to his religion.

Asking for It by Louise O'Neill tells the story of 18 year-old Emma who is on the verge of taking on the world when she attends a party in her small Irish town. Emma takes a pill local boys give her and then can't remember the evens of the evening, but the internet is blasting pictures that the whole town sees, leaving the boys charged with rape and Emma's reputation and psyche in ruins. *Recommended by the publisher for ages 12 and over*.
