Conversations with Friends: A Novel by Sully Rooney: In her debut novel, Rooney explores some unorthodox friendships. Frances and Bobbi used to be lovers in high school, but are still best friends when they head off to start college in Dublin. Melissa, a photographer, and her sickly husband Nick enter their circle of friends. Jack will be missed most of all for his kind words and sense of humor.




