BOOKBUZZ

What's new this month? Here are a few new titles.

In Ireland, the ancient game of hurling is a national pastime. *Great Moments in Hurling* by Sportslife (available on Amazon 12/28/2017) includes photos and information on club matches and legendary players for fans of this sport.

In 1998, Jim Fergus offered his bestselling novel One Thousand White Women: The Journals of May Dodd. He has finally delivered a sequel, *The Vengeance of Mothers*: The Journals of Margaret Kelly and Molly McGill. In the first book, one hundred white women are the first installment to be transported in 1875 to the west with the intent of marrying them to warriors of the Cheyenne and assimilating the tribe into white culture. The Army would receive a hundred horses in return. Federal officials recruited women for the venture in prisons and lunatic asylums. Based on an actual proposal at the time, the secret program was called Brides for Indians. In this sequel, Fergus tells the story of Irish twins Maggie and Susie Kelly who have lost their Cheyenne husbands and baby daughters in an Army massacre. They seek revenge for their loss and help newly arrived white women integrate into the Indian culture, including newcomer Molly McGill.

Philip Freeman is a scholar of Celtic languages and literature who is writing a series of Celtic medieval mysteries that take place in the sixth century. His stories bring to life the struggles of the early Catholic Church in Ireland. The detective is young Sister Deirdre who was trained in the way of ancient Druids by her grandmother and has taken vows as a nun. Similar to Peter Tremaine's Sister Fidelma series, the first three books in Freeman's series are *Saint Brigid's Bones, Sacrifice*, and *The Gospel of Mary*.




