Bookbuzz Bonnie Easton

A blockbuster by an Irish author was released in the United States after its debut in the UK last year. *Normal People: A Novel* by Sally Rooney (author of *Conversations with Friends*) tells the story of the relationship between two fragile young adults, Marianne and Connell. Connell's mother is the housekeeper for Marianne's wealthy family. Rooney explores the nuances of the relationship with their anxieties over sex, class, and social pressures as they grow from teens to college students at Trinity College.

In *The Parting Glass* by Gina Marie Guadagnino, Mary Ballard is the proper lady's maid to Charlotte Walden. She is privy to the gossip and the confidences of the upper class in 1837 New York society, but her real name is Maire O'Farren who came with her brother Seanin (now known as Johnny Prior) to escape the poverty in Ireland. Johnny, employed as a stable boy, and Charlotte fall in love, but Mary is also in love with her mistress. Charlotte's mother insists that her daughter must choose a proper husband and must do it soon.

Rosaria O'Reilly is an amateur detective in two thrillers written by Irish American author Marian McMahon Stanley. In *The Immaculate*, she feels compelled to investigate the murder of her former teacher and mentor Sister Mary Aurelius in Boston. In the next installment of the series, *Buried Troubles*, she puts herself in danger while looking into the death of a young journalism student at the request of his aunt. Her boyfriend is Boston Police Detective Solly Belkin who wishes that she would stay out of his way in solving the case. The investigation takes her from Boston to Ireland.

For nonfiction readers, check out *My Father Left Me Ireland: An American Son's Search for Home* by *National Review* senior writer Michael Brendan Dougherty. The author's parents, an Irish father and an Irish American mother, split up before he was born, leaving his mother to raise him alone in New Jersey as his father returns to Ireland. He feels the loss of a father while growing up and longs for a connection to his Irish roots. When his daughter is born, he wants to sing her the old songs and tell her the stories that his mother told him so that she knows who she is. He tells his story in a succession of letters between him and his estranged father.

Theresa Argie, *The Haunted Housewife*, will join us at 7 pm, Friday, August 16 in the Phil Walsh Cabaret Room to discuss her most recent book and ghost hunting experiences in the Cleveland area. This is an exciting new event at the Club that you won't want to miss! Admission is \$10 at the door.

Theresa Argie's father, Patrick J. Gallagher, emigrated from County Mayo in the 1950s. Theresa and her family grew up immersed in the Irish culture. As a child, she spent years involved with the West Side Irish American Club. She married a wonderful man with strong family roots and a mutual love for Ireland. Today, Theresa and her husband Jay are proud members of the IACES.

Theresa makes her living as an author and public speaker. She often works with Cathi Weber, aka "The Ghost Lady" of Lake County. Besides their work on the Willoughby Ghost Walk, the ladies are heavily involved with various fundraising events and historic preservation projects. Theresa has penned two books; *America's Most Haunted* (Penguin Random House 2014) and her latest, *Love Beyond the Grave: True Tales of Haunted Hearts* (Hestia Media 2018). Theresa shares stories from her new book as well as her personal adventures as a ghost hunter and paranormal investigator. Hear about exotic locations and local hotspots with Cleveland's own *Haunted Housewife*. *Love Beyond the Grave* is a collection of real people, actual events, and historic characters whose stories revolve around a common theme of love. But love can take many forms and manifest in remarkable ways; sometimes it can be dangerous or even deadly. This powerful emotion can defy logic and transcend physical death. Beyond normal, each story has a paranormal element. The author explores the tragic, traumatic, and sometimes terrifying elements of these famous tales of love.
