

Jim was born on September 1, 1949 at Booth Memorial Hospital to parents Julia and Joe Burke who were from Tullamore and Tourmakeady, Ireland. Jim joined siblings, Michael, Fr. Sean (deceased) and Joe and was the first child in



his family born in the United States. He was later joined by siblings, Tom (deceased), Sr. Maureen, Judy, and Kevin. He was baptized at St. Philomena and attended St. Agatha, then Christ the King School at age nine. Jim graduated from Cathedral Latin High School then attended Borromeo Seminary for two years.

For many years Jim played for the Cleveland Blues Rugby Team and also refereed rugby for several years after. He retired at the age of 66 from Giant Eagle after working 50 years in grocery. Retirement gave him even more time to travel to Ireland where he has been over 30 times. He also has been an avid runner, including running in the Dublin Marathon in 2000.

Jim was a resident of Cleveland Heights for many years, moving to Willowick in 2002. He met his wife, Linda at the Irish American Club East Side and they were married January 19, 2001.





Thank you for all you continue to do for our Club. Enjoy the weeks ahead, for now it's time for us to honor you. Enjoy the ride!






















BOOKBUZZ

Bonnie Easton

In researching my family history, I found that my great great grandfather, George Brooks, and his two sons, George W. and Harry, all worked as Canal Boatman in Lewistown, PA, in the late 1870s. Great grandfather Harry married Jennie Dunn, the granddaughter of a local Canal Locktender. When I found a new book titled, The Erie Canal Brides Collection: 7 Romances Develop Along Manmade Waterways of New York and Ohio, I had to share. Irish immigrants built those canals with shovels and pick axes during the 1800s. This book is a set of seven stories by romance authors (Johnnie Alexander, Lauralee Bliss, Ramona K Cecil, Rita Gerlach, Sherri Wilson Johnson, Rose Allen McCauley, and Christina Miller) who describe the building of the canals and how the waterways brought changes to the communities, including land grabs, disease, tourism, racism and competition.

For those of you interested in reading about the Irish Famine, author Charles Egan offered a trilogy written between 2012-2017. *The Killer Snows* tells the story of a box of documents found in an Irish farmhouse in 1990 with the history of one family's suffering and finding love in the worst of times. *The Exile Breed: The Pitiless Epic of the Irish Famine Diaspora* is the tale of the people emigrating to Irish ghettos in Liverpool, Manchester, and London and to slums in American cities. *Cold Is the Dawn: A Novel of Irish Exile and the Great Irish Famine* finishes Egan's story in 1848 as the country starved and food grown in Ireland was exported. The hungry people left to work on waterfronts railroads, and in coal mines and construction in England and America.

To end on a lighter note, Felicity Hayes-McCoy offers her third installment of her Finfarran Peninsula series, *The Mistletoe Matchmaker: A Novel*. Cassie Fitzgerald arrives from Toronto to visit her grandparents on the west coast of Ireland. She befriends the locals and is drawn into their Winter Fest activities. And what about the handsome and exciting Shay. Could he be the one? Other books in this fun series are *The Library at the Edge of the World* and *Summer at the Garden Café*.

During the World War II Blitz, English parents sent their children to the countryside for safety. In Black's story, the British Royal family sends the two princesses to "neutral" Ireland, even though the Irish people are hostile to the Brits. Ellen and Mary are sent with an English intelligence agent and a young Irish detective to protect them at the estate of the Duke of Edenmore. At first, Irish townspeople are unaware of the true identity of these two guests, but, as time goes on, they began to speculate. Passions begin to rise with people who had lost loved ones during the War of Independence and their protectors fear a kidnapping.






