BOOK BUZZ

Bonnie Easton

Historical fiction, time travel, and short stories await you this month.

The Irish Nanny by Sandy Taylor takes place in 1940 London during World War II. A young Irish girl takes a job as a nanny to help support her widowed mother and three sisters. She boards a ship with them for the safety of America, but the ship sinks, she has the baby, and the parents are nowhere to be found. Rose must take charge of the child when they arrive, but will she ever find the baby's family?

Thief of Fate by Jude Deveraux is the finale of the three-part Providence Falls trilogy about Liam O'Connor's love for Cora McLeod in 1844 Ireland, but he stole her from her intended soulmate, Finley Walsh. They have reunited in the present in Providence Falls, North Carolina, but the angels have ordered Liam to persuade Cora to marry Finley or be punished with eternal damnation. Does he save his soul, or follow his heart? The first two books are *Chances of a Lifetime*, and *An Impossible Promise*.

Foster by Claire Keegan tells the story about a young girl whose father places her with relatives in rural Ireland as her mother awaits the birth of another child. She has no idea whether he will come back for her. The unnamed girl narrates her story as she discovers the affection and kindness that she lacks at home. When her mother calls to tell her that her father will be returning, she doesn't know whether to be happy or sad about going home. An earlier version appeared as a short story in *The New Yorker* and the author expanded it into this novella.

Colin Barrett (*Young Skins*) offers eight character-driven short stories in *Homesickness: Stories*. A sword-wielding fugitive disturbs a quiet night at a pub. A wanna-be writer deals with his father's cancer diagnosis. Ghosts attend a funeral party. A veteran policewoman faces the ordinariness in her life after a shooting. Plus, four more stories in the collection will grab your interest. Barrett deals with everyday life and how his characters cope with it.

A noted biographer of politicians has written a new biography of Senator Ted Kennedy, *Ted Kennedy: A Life*. The Massachusetts senator spent 47 years in the Senate. John A. Farrell thinks he has more to tell us about the Kennedy dynasty with a fresh approach to the Lion of the Senate's story with accounts of backroom dealmaking and his accomplishments on civil rights issues, along with the scandals that plagued his life.


