BOOK BUZZ

All kinds of new fiction to tell you about this month.

For those who love to read novels set in World War II, there is *The Paper Man* by Billy O'Callaghan. The story covers the 1930s in Austria to the 1980s in Ireland. Famous Austrian soccer (football) player Matthias Sindelar denounces Adolf Hitler, an action which triggers the Gestapo to put him under surveillance. He falls in love with a young Jewish girl, Rebekah. She is pregnant with Sindelar's child and escapes to stay with relatives in the Jewish section of Cork. Sindelar, who is called The Paper Man, dies the next year. Rebekah and her son, Jack Shine, are happy in Ireland, but she dies when Jack is 10. Now married and a father himself, he finds a bundle of old letters and newspaper clippings in his mother's belongings and tries to piece together his family history to find out who his father was. Loosely based on actual events.

The Connellys of County Down by Tracey Lange (We Are the Brennans) is a family drama that tells the story of three siblings who find themselves living together in the New York suburbs. Tara is a former teacher recently released from prison after serving 18 months on drug charges. Eddie has his young son staying with him while dealing with the aftereffects of a brain injury from a long-ago car accident. Geraldine is trying to hold them all together while working at her payroll job. Complications arise when the police detective who put Tara in prison seems to be developing feelings for her.

The Bee Sting by Paul Murray (Skippy Dies) is set in Ireland. The Barnes family is facing a crisis: Dickie's Volkswagen dealership that he took over from his father is failing; his wife Imelda won't cut back on her spending and is selling her jewelry on eBay; teenage daughter Cass has taken up drinking and her grades are slipping; and 12 year-old P.J. is planning on running away from home because he fears his parents are on the verge of a divorce and he will be sent to boarding school. Dickie is building a shelter in the woods just in case the financial world collapses. Can this family be saved?

The Close by Jane Casey is the tenth installment in the author's Maeve Kerrigan mystery series. Police detective Maeve Kerrigan and her partner Josh Derwent go undercover as a married couple in the Jellocoe Close neighborhood. It appears to be a nice place to live, except for a few creepy characters, one of whom might be planning a murder, but which one? The detectives are supposed to be working on solving the case of a murdered surgeon, but living together in close quarters throws them into a situation where their attraction for each other is allowed free rein.

Sarah Stewart Taylor places her main character Maggie D'Arcy in Ireland as a Garda following her career move from Long Island where she was homicide detective. In the fourth volume in the series, former TV reality star Jade Elliot has been murdered shortly after a domestic violence call to the police, but her toddler daughter is missing. Maggie teams up with a police detective in a nationwide search for a ruthless killer in *A Stolen Child*.
