BOOK BUZZ

Bonnie Easton

New books from bestselling authors have been released recently. Nora Roberts is the grande dame of writing romance and suspense with a paranormal twist. She is starting a new series called the *Lost Bride Trilogy*. The first book is *Inheritance* about Sonya Mactavish, a spunky young woman in Boston who breaks up with her cheating fiancé and quits her job with the graphic design firm where they both worked. Coincidentally, she inherits a spooky mansion in Maine from her father's twin brother whom she had never met and moves there. Of course, the house is haunted, and her dreams become filled with the stories of the murders of young brides. The dreams provide clues as to how she can break the curse. She must live in the house for three years to collect her inheritance.

Long Island: A Novel by Colm Toibin is the long-awaited sequel to his bestseller Brooklyn (2009). The author revisits Eilis Lacey and her husband, Tony Fiorello, 20 years later in 1976 on Long Island where they live with their two teenagers. Her husband's relatives surround them in the same neighborhood. Tony owns a plumbing business, and she is a bookkeeper. One day, an Irishman shows up at her door and tells her that that his wife is expecting Tony's child. He tells her that when the baby is born, he will leave it on her doorstep. Eilis is distraught and decides to visit the home of her birth and reconnect with her family. She wants nothing to do with Tony's child, and she sees her old flame again, Jim Farrell, in her hometown. As they rekindle their relationship, he fails to mention that he is engaged to her best friend. A love triangle develops.

Some of Us Are Looking is the second installment of Carlene O'Connor's County Kerry Mystery series. The first book is No Strangers Here. The setting is the beautiful Dingle Peninsula on the southwest coast of Ireland. The crime solvers are Detective Sergeant Cormac O'Brien and veterinarian Dimpna Wilde. Not in O'Connor's usual cozy mystery style, this book is darker and more sinister than her other popular series. A caravan of young RV travelers selling their wares are camping nearby when an elderly local is killed in a hit-and-run accident. Animals are found mutilated. One of the young campers is found dead, tied to a tree with a rabbit's foot wrapped around her wrist and her left hand missing. Dimpna is horrified at what is happening to the animals, but more horrified that there may be a serial killer on the loose. O'Brien and the vet join forces to investigate.


