BOOK BUZZ

Here are a couple of historical fiction titles to start off with this month.

Ashley Herzog is a Cleveland writer who has published two recent books on the Irish immigrating to America. *Lake Erie Monsters: A Story of the Cleveland Irish*, published in 2019, takes place in 1888 and is based on the author's own ancestors. Mamie Chambers leaves Ireland with her fiancé, Peter, and her two brothers, but Peter disappears and is nowhere to be found. Mamie finds work in a saloon with Kate Morrison. They run into trouble with the local mob and with gossiping neighborhood women who disapprove of two women operating a bar. And who is this guy who shows up and claims to be Peter when Mamie knows he is an imposter?

In 2022, the same author released *Many a Knot:* A Story of the Titanic Irish. Mary Mullins attended Loretta Convent School for Girls in Dublin. When she finishes her studies, she runs away from her wealthy, abusive family with her friend Denis Lennon, to board the Titanic in Queenstown. They have chosen her a husband whom she does not love. Her oldest brother chases the couple to the docks with a gun. Four days after the ship has set sail, it hits an iceberg. Mary and Denis were played in the successful film Titanic as Jack and Rose by Leonardo DiCaprio and Kate Winslet.

What is more traditionally Irish than soda bread? A new cookbook published this year has some suggestions for variations. *Irish Soda Bread Cookbook: Easy Homemade Irish Soda Bread Recipes: Delicious Ways to Make Irish Soda Bread* by Alicia Rowley starts with the four-ingredient original recipe of flour, baking soda, buttermilk, and salt from the 1800s and adds variations like caraway seeds, raisins, chocolate chips, and other modern-day twists. Serve warm with a pat of Irish butter.

Tomorrow with Bayonets: Dublin: July 1921-July 1922 is available on Kindle. Derek Molyneux and Darren Kelly tell the story of the turbulent days of the Irish Civil War. The clashes between the Provisional Government's National Army and the IRA are brutal with civilians caught in the crossfire and Michael Collins leading the charge. Explosions, assassinations, and unending warfare define the era with brothers fighting against brothers. The question is, can Ireland survive its growing pains?

Oldies but goodies for this month: *Star of the Sea* by Joseph O'Connor, *When All Is Said* by Anne Griffin, *To School Through the Fields* by Alice Taylor, the Nuala Anne McGrail romantic suspense series by Andrew Greeley, and the *Of Irish Blood* trilogy by Mary Pat Kelly (*Galway Bay*, *Of Irish Blood*, and *Irish Above All*).
