

It's time to curl up in your favorite chair with a good book and a hot cup of tea.

Being Various: New Irish Short Stories by Lucy Caldwell offers 24 gems by such bestselling Irish authors as Stuart Neville, Adrian McKinty, Sally Rooney, and Kevin Barry. Rewind by Catherine Ryan Howard is a thriller about a social media star who desires some quiet time in a remote cottage near Cork when she suspects her husband of having an affair, but someone is watching her every move with a hidden camera. Her husband reports her missing after a few days and a Dublin journalist follows up on the story to discover what may have happened to her. There are lots of creepy suspects with secret pasts.

Country: A Novel by Michael Hughes takes place in Northern Ireland around 1996 as both sides of the conflict between the IRA and the British attempt an uneasy ceasefire. Reviewers of this book are calling it a modern version of Homer's *Iliad*. Nellie is a British informant married to an IRA soldier. British Special Forces rolls out against her husband's unit and the IRA retaliates as Nellie is transported out of the country. Nothing much has changed from ancient Greece to modern day.

Have you begun planning your holiday baking? A good place to start is *Bigger Bolder Baking: A Fearless Approach to Baking Anytime*, *Anywhere* by Irish-born baker Gemma Stafford who has her own YouTube baking show. She features basic recipes like banana bread and cinnamon rolls as well as Irish favorites like shortbread and rhubarb crumble, but she tackles more challenging recipes like White Chocolate and Mascarpone Mousse and Salted Butterscotch Pots de Crème. 


