For mystery readers:

The Liar's Girl by Catherine Ryan Howard tells the story of a serial killer who killed five young women by drowning them in the Grand Canal. Will Hurley confesses and is sent to a psychiatric hospital. His girlfriend Alison flees to Amsterdam. Ten years later, another victim is found and Will agrees to help the police in the investigation but will only talk to Alison. She reluctantly returns to Dublin.

Too Close to Breathe: A Novel is the debut novel of Olivia Kiernan. In this tale, Detective Chief Superintendent Frankie Sheehan returns from medical leave after being shot and still suffering from PTSD. Her first case is a murder disguised as a suicide. She is confronted by the victim's secrets in life and in death.

The setting is the Appalachian Mountains of Big Gap, Tennessee where a community of Irish Travelers have settled. Brynn Callahan is a former Marine MP who returns home after an IED explosion. She brings home her cadaver dog, Wilco. Brynn and Wilco discover in their walk in the woods the body of a woman she knows and must help the local police solve the crime. She enlists the help of the reluctant Irish Travelers. *Splintered Silence* by Susan Furlong is the first in the Bone Gap Travelers series.

In a Galway mansion, an addicted single mother from an Anglo-Irish family is found dead with her two young children, Maude and Jack, fending for themselves. Cormac Reilly is a new policeman sent to investigate. Twenty years later, Reilly is again involved with the family when Jack

dies from an apparent suicide, but Maude and Jack's girlfriend Aisling are sure he was murdered. *The Ruin* by Dervla McTiernan provides an edgy debut novel.

Lolly the Trolley will pick us up at the Club at 10 am and return us to the Club by 4 pm. Our narrated tour will include stops at St. Aloysius Church with pastor Fr. Mark Hobson, a stroll in the beautiful Irish Cultural Garden, and a visit to Immaculate Conception Church in Cleveland – affectionately known as "The Mac", where Fr. Frank Godic is pastor.

Midway through our tour, we'll stop for lunch at one of the oldest Irish establishments in Cleveland – the Flat Iron.

After lunch, we'll make our way across the street to the Irish Famine Memorial on the banks of the Cuyahoga River.

As Lolly winds her way back to the Club, we'll hear more about various points of interests such as St. Malachi's, The Flats, Irish Town Bend, St. Mary's on the Flats, the Soldiers & Sailors Monument and more.






