PAST CLUB PRESIDENTS Linda Walsh

As we approach our 40th Anniversary, I thought it might be fun to look back at who served as President and some interesting things that occurred during their terms. You will see more in our 40th Anniversary Book at our dance on January 27, 2018. The original planning committee for our Club was Gerald Quinn, Patrick Talty, Cliff Faudree and Jack Carroll. In January 1978, prior to the Super Bowl, they held the first organizational meeting of what is now the Irish American Club East Side.

Gerald Quinn 1978-79

The first decision was to establish our General Membership meetings on the second Monday of every month and the Executive Board meetings the last Monday of every month.

William Carney 1979-1980

The membership continued to grow and the Club relocated to the Elk's Lodge in Euclid which also provided us with a kitchen facility. The Schanachie had become our monthly newsletter.

William Homan 1980-82

The building committee was realigned to become the financial planning committee. Its purpose was to determine the feasibility of property and plan the financial growth to achieve the goal of securing our own building.

On Monday, October 21, 1981 the general membership overwhelmingly approved the purchase of our current building and on November 15 our newly formed construction committee began to transform the purchased furniture store into our present home.

Michael (Mickey) Coyne 1982-84

Federal funds, available for the renovation of storefronts, were used to re-face our clubhouse. At the same time plans were begun to renovate the lower level.

Gerald Quinn 1984-85

Our new Dublin style pub and cabaret rooms were dedicated on May 18, 1985. Entertainment continued to expand.

Michael Coyne 1985-87

Membership climbed to over 3,000. The Padraic Pearse Center was established and our Ladies Drill Team was formed.

Helen Bacon 1987-88

Helen was the first female President. On Sunday, September 27, 1987 the Padraic Pearse Center officially opened their library.

Michael Coyne 1988-1990

Our Club picnic was held at the AMLA grounds. Irish entertainment was provided by such groups as Dermot Henry, Cahal Dunne, Brendan Boyer and many more.

Patrick Coyne 1990-92

Our "Adopt a Chair" program was formed to help with replacement of chairs at a cost of \$15,500 for 700 chairs. By September 1991, \$12,894.00 had been raised, and at the culmination of the program an anonymous donation of \$10,000.00 was received.

Phil Walsh 1992-93

A new fundraiser was adopted - the St. Patrick's Day Raffle with an initial profit of \$29,060.00.

Patrick Coyne 1993-94

Our Corned Beef Dinner crew served 700 dinners. The Padraic Pearse Center had their first Silent Auction Spring Fling.

Jim Heckman 1994-96

The membership approved the new position of Club bookkeeper to assist the Treasurer. Our Club was host to the United Irish Societies Annual Parade Awards Banquet.

Debbie Hanson 1996-98

A celebration of the 20th Anniversary of the Club included a Memorial Mass and Champagne Breakfast on the morning of January 24 followed by a dance that evening. The highlight of the day was the ceremony of the burning of the mortgage.

Michael Coyne 1998-2000

A quilting guild, the "Celtic Threaders" was formed. Proceeds of \$3,800.00 from the rummage sale were used to help purchase new uniforms for the Ladies Drill Team.

Bruce Greig 2000-02

The Irish American East Side Pipe Band was formed. Moving into the 21st century, The Club created a website and the Padraic Pearse Center renamed the library "The Lonnie McCauley Library".

Linda Walsh 2002-04

The lower level remodeling was completed. 25th Anniversary celebrations included a Memorial Mass and the Anniversary Dance featuring Andy Cooney.

Tim O'Brien 2004-06

Monthly Club Dinners, Rummage Sale and Ladies Communion Breakfast continued to be well attended. The month of May found us celebrating the 20th Anniversary of the opening of the Pub.

Michael Coyne 2006-08

In February, the Club welcomed for the first time "The Elders". The Padraic Pearse Center offered a four-week course on Irish History with Sister Maureen Burke.

Patrick Coyne 2008-10

The Club celebrated Christmas in July with a pig roast and chicken BBQ. In May, membership approved a three-year contract with Devring Catering.

Linda Walsh 2010-12

The Ladies Drill Team celebrated its 25th year of marching for the Club. We welcomed the Wolf Tones in February.

Linda Burke 2012-14

Pub Entertainment, Chili Cook Offs and Super Bowl parties continue at the Club. More fundraisers were planned to replenish the building fund.

Francis McGarry 2014-16

Building improvements were made with the construction crew refinishing the bars in the upper hall. The "O'Brien-Campbell Patio" was opened and the Bluestone Division of the Ancient Order of Hibernians established monthly meetings at the Club.

Kevin McCluskey 2016-18

Our current President, in his second term is hard at work. This year he organized "Thirsty Thursdays" on the O'Brien-Campbell Patio. The fun evenings were a huge success and brought many members together and allowed them to show off their cooking skills. Progress is also being made by Kevin and company to update some of our equipment throughout the Club.

New titles for you in the New Year:

For the first installment of her new series *Natchez Trace*, author Pam Hillman sets her romance, *The Promise of Breeze Hill*, in her native Mississippi. The management of the Breeze Hill plantation falls to Isabella Bartholomew after the death of her brother. Connor O'Shea arrives from Ireland in 1791 as an indentured carpenter to try to save enough money to bring his two brothers to America. He assists his mistress Isabella in trying to save the plantation, but are there other forces at work who are trying to take control of her property?

The Ghosts of Galway by Ken Bruen is the 13th edition in his Jack Taylor mystery series. It was rated A- in Entertainment Weekly's best books and the Top Pick in Mystery in the publication BookPage. A hard-boiled disgraced cop takes a job as a nightshift security guard. His Ukrainian boss offers him an off-the-books assignment to find The Red Book. This book of heresy is in the hands of a rogue priest who left the Vatican and is hiding in Galway. Just to complicate the situation, his old girlfriend walks back into his life and turns out to be a part of the plot.

The Library at the Edge of the World: A Novel by Irish author Felicity Hayes-McCoy tells the story of Hanna Casey. She divorced her English husband for adultery five years earlier and moved back to the West Coast of Ireland where she grew up and moved in with her mother. Now, she drives a bookmobile for a living. She feels that her life is going nowhere and decides to renovate a cottage she inherited just when local politics threaten go close the library. The neighbors whom she has been ignoring since her return rally around her to offer friendship and support.

Iconic Irish author Roddy Doyle offers his newest work, *Smile: A Novel*. It is his first attempt at psychological suspense as he tells the story of Victor. He meets an old classmate in a pub. He barely remembers him from the Christian Brothers school, but he is motivated to relive painful memories and his regrets while reevaluating his life.




