The following members have been nominated for the following positions.



#### Book Buzz Bonnie Easton

Publishers have been releasing an avalanche of new books by Irish and Irish American authors in the last few months. Lucky for us, but difficult to keep up with all the new titles. Here are a few.

**Trespasses:** A Novel by Louise Kennedy tells the story of Cushia Laverty, a parochial schoolteacher living in a town near Belfast during The Troubles of the 1970s. In the evenings, she helps her mother run a pub where she meets a married Protestant lawyer, Michael Agnew, who defends IRA members, and begins an affair with him. Violence is a part of their lives, both in Cushia's school and in her mother's pub. The book was made into a TV series by a British film company with Gillian Anderson starring as Cushia's mother.

**These Days:** A Novel by Lucy Caldwell takes place in Belfast in 1941during the Belfast Blitz of World War II. The story centers around the lives of sisters Audrey and Emma Bell, the daughters of a prominent doctor. They are still trying to live their everyday lives surrounded by rubble. Audrey is engaged to a doctor while Emma is falling in love with her supervisor, Sylvia, and the challenges their relationship will face. Daily lives consist of living with their personal gas masks close by and bombings by the Luftwaffe.

*The Sirens: A Novel* by Emily Hunt tells readers about two sets of sisters living in two different centuries. In 2019, Lucy has a recurring dream about two sisters drowning and wakes to find herself sleepwalking into the room of her ex-lover to strangle him. Terrified, she flees to her sister Jess' home in New South Wales, Australia, where their parents lived but Jess has disappeared. Her neighbor assures Lucy that she is fine and will be home soon. Flashback to 1800 finds sisters Mary and Eliza moving away from the seaside in Australia after their mother disappeared in the water. They have a violent encounter that results in their deportation on a convict ship back to Australia. The author throws in murder, sexual predators, otherworldly orphans, and mistaken identity just to keep the story interesting.

*Heart Be at Peace: A Novel* by Donal Ryan (*Queen of Dirt Island*) takes place in a small town in Ireland during an economic collapse, but townspeople are optimistic and looking forward to recovery. The story unfolds in twenty-one different voices, each having their own viewpoint, but young people are drawn to the promise of fast money while the older generation pushes back. The whole community is at risk of chaos as each of the twenty-one characters draws readers into their lives and an evil emerges.

*The Lost Bookshop* by Evie Woods is a story about the magic and mystery of books. Three strangers—Opaline, Martha, and Henry—are about to discover that their mundane lives are every bit as extraordinary as the ones they find on the pages of their beloved books. They learn to unlock secrets lying within the books on the store's shelves.

*Silent as the Grave: A Molly Murphy Mystery* by Rhys Bowen and her daughter Clare Brogles are back with their 21st book featuring retired detective Molly Murphy Sullivan. Molly is now the mother of three children, including a newborn, and her husband, Daniel, is off working in Washington, D.C. during the Easter season of 1909. A friend is a writer on a movie set and her adopted teen daughter, Bridie, is acting in the film. She is almost killed when she is tied to a railroad track. Molly sticks around the set to watch over her. As the movie progresses, more of the special effects are not working as planned and sabotage is suspected, so Molly is called in undercover to investigate.
