BookbuzzBonnie Easton

As we near the end of 2018, here are several historical fiction titles you might enjoy. The first two items are fictional accounts of real people.

Nuala O'Connor in *Becoming Belle* tells the rags-to-riches story of Isabel Bilton. She is the eldest daughter in a middle-class military family who leaves home to become Belle in a dance hall in London. In 1891, she marries a member of the Irish aristocracy to become the Countess of Clancarty. Her husband's family does not approve of the match.

The Kennedy Debutante by Kerri Maher relates the tragic story of Kathleen "Kick" Kennedy of the Irish Catholic Kennedy clan. Her parents, Joseph and Rose, do not approve of her choice in Protestant Billy Hartington, the future Duke of Devonshire. This is the 1940s when marrying outside of your religion meant ostracism from your family. World War II is looming large in Europe where she is living. Do Kick's loyalties lie with her famous family or with the man she loves?

Here are a couple more novels that deal with historical events in the 1900s.

The Latecomers by Helen Klein Ross tells the story of 16 year-old Bridey who runs away from home to America in 1908 with her fiancé Thom, but he dies of a fever aboard the ship and leaves Bridey pregnant. She finds work as a maid for the Hollingworth family. Her employer adopts her son Vincent. Tragedy strikes and secrets haunt the family for decades until Vincent's daughter unravels the mystery.

From Irish author Peter Cunningham, *Acts of Allegiance: A Novel*, the story of a man with divided loyalties in Northern Ireland in the 1960s. Marty Ransom has a job with the Department of External Affairs. Alison is an Anglo-Irish friend of Marty and his wife Sugar who is working for the British Home Office. She recruits him to spy for the English and they enter into an affair. His cousin, Iggy, is a bomb maker for the IRA. With the violence of Bloody Sunday, and the English desperate to find the bomber, Marty is conflicted. Whose side should he take?

For children, learning history may be more enjoyable when presented as a story. *Hunger: A Tale of Courage* by Donna Jo Napoli is aimed at children ages 9-12. In 1846 in Galway, Lorraine is 12 years old and is struggling with her family during the Potato Famine. Lorraine's friend Susanna helps her friends survive by sneaking food to them, but she doesn't understand the desperation and hopelessness they feel. Told in first person, the reality of the famine comes alive.




