



games. Please join us! We plan to have specials on buckets of beer and maybe even a drink special too! Bring your favorite snack to share and help us cheer our Browns to victory!


2019-2020 PINOCHLE LEAGUE
































STEAK SHOOT PLAYERS BEAT THE HEAT

FAMINE MEMORIAL MASS

We will celebrate the annual Famine Memorial Mass at the memorial site in the Flats. at 5 pm, Saturday, September 21.

Each year, since the monument's dedication in 2000, many hundreds have come to remember and honor those who fled the famine and left Ireland to seek a better life in America. Many of our ancestors were among those brave

people who hoped to have a better life here. The "coffin ships" prevented many from realizing that dream, but others were able to reach our ports.

This Mass is our way of remembering the sacrifices made by so many of our Irish ancestors - men, women and children who are very much a part of our heritage and history.

We are very fortunate to have Fr. Jim O'Donnell and Fr. Jim Cosgrove as our celebrants at this special Mass. Fr. O'Donnell has been with us since the original dedication Mass, and Fr. Cosgrove was welcomed as our celebrant for the first time last year. We will continue to donate the offertory collection to the Little Brothers and Sisters of the Eucharist. Thank you for your generosity.

Once again, we are indebted to Phillip Parente for providing folding chairs so that you don't have to bring your own. We are also blessed to have the St. Malachi music ministry join us. We look forward to a beautiful late afternoon on the river as we remember those that came before us.

We hope you will join us at this beautiful site on the Cuyahoga River across from the Flat Iron Café as we come together for the Famine Memorial Mass. Afterwards, stop in for a bite and a beverage at one of the oldest Irish establishments in the Flats.

BookbuzzBonnie Easton

Here are my selections for you this month.

The Irishman's Daughter by V. S. Alexander takes us back to the Great Famine of 1845. Briana Walsh's father is the manager of a wealthy landowner's estate. Briana loves Rory Caulfield, a farmer who lives nearby, but the potato crop fails and hunger follows. Rory and his fellow rebels seek vengeance against the apathetic landowners. Newly married and pregnant, Briana arrives in Boston with the hope that Rory will soon follow.

The Chain by Adrian McKinty is set in Northern Ireland during the Troubles. In an intense tale, Rachel Klein finds herself in a deadly Ponzi scheme through no fault of her own. Her daughter is kidnapped at the same time that she fears her cancer may have returned. To keep the chain going, she must pay a \$25,000 ransom and kidnap someone else's child. Otherwise, her daughter will die. She and her military trained brother-in-law hunt down the predators to rescue her daughter.

Another historical mystery series has come to my attention. Cora Harrison, born in Cork, writes the Reverend Mother Mysteries that take place in 1920s Cork, Ireland. The amateur sleuth is Reverend Mother Aquinas. She is a woman in her 70s who oversees a school for the poor during the Irish Civil War. The six entries offered so far are A Shameful Murder, A Shocking Assassination, Beyond Absolution, A Gruesome Discovery, Death of a Novice, and Murder at the Queens Old Castle.

A friend gave me a copy of an entry in the popular *Pete the Cat* series *The Great Leprechaun Chase* by James Dean. It is aimed at the picture book crowd of children from ages three to eight and contains tear-out St. Patrick's Day cards, a poster. and stickers. Something to keep in mind for the holidays.
