

#### **Nominations for Officers 2018-2019**

On Monday, May 14, 2018 at the General Membership Meeting, nominations for Executive Board positions will be presented for the 2018-2019 term. Members in good standing who have paid dues for the current year and have attended 5 meetings in the previous 12 months shall be eligible for nomination to Club offices. Those nominating candidates will come forward with their current membership card and will have two minutes to speak. Once their nomination is seconded the candidate will have one minute to accept the nomination.

The following offices are open for nomination: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Secretary and two At-Large positions.

The election will take place by secret ballot on June 11, 2018 at the General Membership Meeting. You must have signed in for 3 meetings in the previous 12 months in order to vote. Absentee ballots will be permitted for the election of officers. Procedures for the submission of absentee ballots shall be established by the Election Committee.

#### **Coming Soon: New Medicare Cards**

The Centers for Medicare Services (CMS) is launching a year-long project to replace all Medicare beneficiaries' cards, beginning in April. Your replacement card will have a new 11 character ID that is unique to you and uses a combination of letters and numbers instead of your Social Security number.

Ohio's replacement cards are scheduled to be mailed after June, 2018 to the address on file with Social Security. If you moved recently, contact Social Security at 1-800-722-1213 to report your change of address.

During the transition, watch out for scammers who are already targeting those scheduled to receive new cards. Medicare officials say they will never make a personal visit to your home, nor ask you for private information or any money as a condition of getting a new Medicare number and card. If you have doubts, contact the Medicare helpline, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at 1-800-633-4227.

Let's take a look at some nonfiction selections this month. *Box of Butterflies: The Unexpected Blessings All Around Us* by Irish-born actress and producer Roma Downey is an inspirational work filled with her personal insights, Bible passages, and poetry. She talks of losing both her parents early in her life and her friendship with *Touched by an Angel* costar Della Reese, who died in November 2017.

Mark Bailey has compiled a book of nine essays about important immigrants who helped to forge the character of our nation in *Nine Irish Lives: The Thinkers, Fighters, and Artists Who Helped Build America*. Each essay is written with admiration by descendants of Irish immigrants like Rosie O'Donnell, Tom Hayden, Michael Moore, and Pierce Brosnan. They have chosen as role models Father Flannagan of Boys Town, orphanage founder Margaret Haughery, peace negotiator Niall O'Dowd, and labor leader Mother Jones. They are all extraordinary men and women whose causes are still important in to us today.

Are you working on your family history? *The Family Tree Irish Genealogy Guide: How to Trace Your Ancestors in Ireland* by Claire Santry was published in 2017. It contains resources for both the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland. There are historical timelines, sample records, resource lists, and detailed information about where and how to find your ancestors online.

## Bylaws, Rules of Order, Standing Rules and Customs By Tom Curran, IACES Parliamentarian

Over the past few months, several informal conversations have taken place regarding old business conducted by the Irish American Club East Side (the Club). I referenced my *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (RONR)*, the authoritative directive to parliamentary procedures that the Club recognizes and uses to keep order and management. I brought my findings before the Executive Board and was directed by President McCluskey to briefly summarize the details.

Meetings are held to make informative decisions. A *motion* is a formal proposal by a member, in a meeting, that the group take certain action. It's what happens to a motion, once it is passed, that questions have arisen.

A motion, when properly presented and acted upon, can be used for general purposes such as hiring a band, setting a date for an event or spending of funds for capital improvements. These "general housekeeping motions" once executed, become void after action.

A *Main Motion* can also be used to change or amend the Club's Bylaws, which are governing procedures, or deviate from RONR by proposing amendment changes. A motion whose intention is to change law or procedure needs to designate what the intention is. Failure of the motion to state this results in the motion becoming improper and unenforceable. For example - if a motion is made to allow the Club to take a certain action *AND FAILS TO DESIGNATE THE INTENTION TO AMEND THE BYLAWS OR STANDING RULES*, the motion becomes improper and is dead on the floor.

A *Custom* or *Policy* should not be confused with Bylaws or Rules of Order. The Club may be in the habit of doing something over and over again which becomes an "unwritten" law. It become the norm, however cannot be enforced. This is called *latent ambiguity,* the common practice of an action that isn't law.

Standing Rules are administrative details and are not important enough to be in the Bylaws and do not relate to the conduct of a meeting. A Standing Rule should not be confused with Policy. Standing Rules are designated such when the motion is made where Policy is a custom or habit.

In summary, motions are made as directives to take action. A motion can be made to change Bylaws, Standing Rules or for general housekeeping purposes. Failure of a motion to be properly designated in its formation makes the motion improper and becomes a dead issue. Customs and Policies are habits and practices that although have been followed, are unenforceable (latent ambiguity).




