Executive Board Election 2024-2025

Nominations for club officers, the Executive Board, will be May 13 at the General Membership meeting. The officers to be elected are President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Membership Secretary for one year terms. In addition there are two Member at Large two year open positions.

Nominations will be taken from the floor at the May general membership meeting. Any member in good standing, who has paid dues and attended five meetings in the past 12 months is eligible to run for office. Any member in good standing who has paid dues and attended three meetings in the past 12 months is eligible to nominate and vote for candidates for the above offices. Nominating members must show their current membership card and will have two minutes to nominate their candidate. Nominated

members must show their current membership card and will have one minute to accept their nomination.

The election will be held June 10 at the General Membership meeting. Members in good standing must show a current membership card to receive a ballot. Absentee ballots will be available and issued when requested in writing from members in good standing. Write in ballots will be accepted. Write in candidates must also be members in good standing, having paid dues and attended five meetings from July 2023-May 2024.

BOOK BUZZ Bonnie Easton

To start us off this month, here are a couple of nonfiction books about two of the most significant events in Irish history.

The 1981 Irish Hunger Strike: An Account from Declassified British Documents is a new book by Ohio 6th District Appellate Court Judge Michael C. Mentel of Columbus. Ten men died in 217 days in the H Block of Long Kesh Prison. For centuries, the Irish had suffered from persecution and imprisonment without trial. The British government gave them special status as political prisoners in 1971 but rescinded it in 1976. By 1981, the prisoners acted by starting a hunger strike. Mentel analyzes the history that eventually led to the 1998 Good Friday Agreement.

Plentiful Country: The Great Potato Famine and the Making of Irish New York is offered by historian Tyler Anbinder. In 1845, a fungus devastated Ireland's potato crop and left millions starving. By 1855, about a third of all adults living in New York City were Irish immigrants who were facing discrimination in finding work and in living their daily lives. Anbinder tells the stories of these immigrants and how they eventually succeeded and thrived in their new home.

And a couple new fiction books which, coincidentally, both involve nuns.

Sisters of Belfast: A Novel by Melanie Maure tells the story of twin sisters who are orphaned in 1941 by the bombing of Belfast in World War II. As teenagers, the McGuire twins take different paths—Isabel rebels and leaves Ireland for Newfoundland where she marries Declan Kelly, while Aelish takes vows to become a nun. They have no contact with each other until 1955 when Aelish hears from Isabel's husband that her sister is ill and has twins of her own. She needs help. They return to Ireland together to face the pain of their past where unwed mothers and their babies were treated cruelly under the care of the Sisters of Bethlehem.

The seventeenth installment of Ken Bruen's Jack Taylor thriller series is *Galway Confidential*. Jack Taylor awakes from his coma after eighteen months to a different world. His city was drastically hit by the pandemic. He is still recovering from the injuries of his assault, but he learns of vicious attacks on nuns and homeless people by different perpetrators and feels the need to assist in the investigations. As usual, he is bolstered by regular shots of Jameson's.

Oldies but goodies for this month: *Circle of Friends* by Maeve Binchy, *Irish Country Doctor* by Patrick Taylor, *Born In* trilogy (*Born in Fire, Born in Ice, Born in Shame*) by Nora Roberts, *1916* by Morgan Llywelyn, and *Princes of Ireland* and *Rebels of Ireland* by Edward Rutherfurd.


