


Book Buzz

Bonnie Easton

This month's selections focus on home and family. Next month, stories of murder and mayhem will return.

The Boy from the Sea: A Novel by Garrett Carr is the story of a baby boy who is found abandoned in a Donegal fishing village in 1973. He is given the name Brendan and adopted by the Bonnar family—father Ambrose, mother Christine, and brother Declan with an aunt and a grandfather living close by. The town's fortunes rise and fall through the years with changes in the economic conditions. Seafaring can be a dangerous and demanding profession. The town is fascinated by the boy who has no history and no idea where he came from as they watch him grow up into a quirky, charismatic young man.

Our Wicked Histories by Amy Goldsmith is classified as a teen horror thriller. Nell had a group of friends at her school in England, but she is now estranged from them after an incident that led to her suspension. No one wants to talk about what happened, but she wants to earn their forgiveness, hoping it will lead her to admission into a prestigious art school that she wishes to attend and to reunite with her former best friend, Lottie Wren. She accepts their invitation to spend Halloween weekend at Wren Hall, a damp and drafty manor house in Ireland, but there are rumors of something living in the nearby lake. Who will survive the weekend?

Where the Heart Should Be by Sarah Crossan is another teen book, but this one is a love story. It takes place in the house of a wealthy British landlord during the famine in 1846. The heir to inherit the estate is his nephew, John, and he and Nell fall in love. The relationship is forbidden, so they must meet in secret. She is helping to keep her family alive while John has five sisters back home who need his support. Their story is written in verse.

The Last Leprechauns of Ireland by Kevin J. Woods is a children's story. The leprechauns are said to have mined gold underneath the ground in Ireland from the beginning of time. There were millions of them back then, but by the mid-19th century, their numbers have dwindled. The author tells their story as the history of Ireland from the Druids to the Famine. Now there are only 236 left. They have to make contact with humankind if they are to have any hope of surviving.

Alice Taylor, the author of the Irish classic *To School Through the Fields*, is back with another memoir titled *A Place Called Home*. She spent her childhood on a farm in North Cork and now lives in the small town of Innishannon in West Cork. Both places are special to her

for the people and the special memories they hold. She calls both of them home.

Irish Mythology: Enthralling Myths, Folktales, and Legends of Gods, Goddesses, and Mythological Creatures in Ancient Ireland by Billy Wellman is a short history of Ireland's heritage through her myths and legends. The author explains the four cycles of Irish mythology: the Mythological Cycle, the Ulster Cycle, the Fenian Cycle, and the Historical Cycle with an explanation of how Catholicism has influenced the retelling of the stories. These tales play a part in defining Ireland's identity.
