



Let's spotlight some recent Irish history books this month.

Lincoln and the Irish: The Untold Story of How the Irish Helped Abraham Lincoln Save the Union by Irish American journalist Niall O'Dowd is a series of brief sketches of several men and women who aided the United States during the Civil War. At a time when Irish immigrants were perceived to be of a lower status than even slaves, they distinguished themselves on the battlefield and provided some of his top generals.

Dagger John: Archbishop John Hughes and the Making of Irish America by John Loughery is a biography of an Irish immigrant who founded St. John's College (now Fordham University), built St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, pioneered parochial education, and practiced diplomacy. He fought the bigotry aimed at the Irish to help them find acceptance in the United States after enduring the famine and troubles in Ireland

The King and the Catholics: England, Ireland and the fight for Religious Freedom, 1780-1829 by acclaimed author Lady Antonia Fraser tracks the history of religious prejudice in England and Ireland from the Gordon Riots of 1780 where 285 people were killed to the joint work of Irish Catholic Daniel O'Connell and the English Duke of Wellington to pass the Roman Catholic Relief Act fifty years later.

Kevin McGinty Obituary

Kevin McGinty, age 78, passed away unexpectedly September 15th, 2018. Kevin lived in Euclid, Ohio, a native of Castlebar, County Mayo, Ireland. Beloved husband of the late Kathleen (nee Hastings); loving father of Kevin (Sue), Jean Humphrey (Bob), Christine Susnik (John), Captain Megan McGinty PhD., and Patrick (Jaime). The proud grandfather of Caitlan, Devon, Elizabeth, Jonathan, Diana, Christine, Kevin, Angelina, Kathleen, Daniel, James and Ronan; great grandfather of Ridley Rose, brother of Kitty, Muriel Ainsworth, Jean Foy, Desmond, Gerry and the late Patrick, Mary Ennis and Monica (all of Ireland).

Kevin was known as a talented leadership figure throughout the Irish American community in Cleveland. He was a founding member of the Irish American Club-East Side of Cleveland, as well as the Mayo Society of Greater Cleveland. As a young man, Kevin was also known locally as an athlete participating in Gaelic (Irish) football for St. Patrick's in Cleveland. However, it was later in life he became known internationally as Director of the Cleveland Irish Players, producing over 50 plays with local actors in the Cleveland and Pittsburgh areas, as well as Ireland. He was also given a theatre honor by the Irish Society of Pittsburgh.

Kevin was also a lifetime member of the Pioneer Total Abstinence Society, and was honored by them in 2013, as well as being the Grand Marshall of the Cleveland St. Patrick's Day Parade in that same year. Kevin was also known as the radio voice and co-host of the program "Sounds of Britain and Ireland," a Time Warner Broadcast, for over six years.

After immigrating in 1960, Kevin served in the Ohio Nat'l Guard for eight years and became a valued employee of Meisner Inc. for construction projects. However, his passion for Ireland never faltered. Among his many hours as a volunteer, he was also a founding member of the Irish American

Archives Society of the Western Reserve Historical Society, serving as Treasurer. He also found time to be an advocate of the MacBride Principles of Fair Employment—a fair hiring agenda for North American Corporations intended to curb discriminating hiring practices in Northern Ireland. His advocacy included testifying before committees of the Ohio General Assembly in the 1990s.

He was also the Editor on the Ohio Irish Times for 20 years in the 1990s through 2011. The publication was brought forward after the death of his dear friend Jim McCoy who was the Publisher of Ohio Irish Bulletin. Both were a local source of information about Irish Culture and the Civil Rights movement in Ireland, athletics, music and dance.

Kevin was sometimes compared by fellow advocates as a devoted and trusting friend, epitomizing Rudyard Kipling's famed composition entitled "The Thousandth Man." That is, the person you can trust to always have your back, and whose loyalty endures "to stand by your side...to the gallows foot, and after."

Safe home, Kevin.


