



BOOKBUZZ

Old friends are back with new books in their series. The thirteenth Jack Taylor novel by Ken Bruen is *Galway Girl*. Three Guards are murdered and Jack’s former colleagues beg him for help. A trio of young killers with different styles wants to take Jack down and force him to face a personal tragedy from his past.

An Irish Country Family by Patrick Taylor continues *The Irish Country* series. In the fictional town of Ballybucklebo in Northern Ireland, Dr. Barry Laverty tells of his work as a junior partner of Dr. Fingal O’Reilly and his life with his wife Sue and their struggle to have a family of their own. They are surrounded by a supportive community.

The Crossing at Cypress Creek: A Natchez Trace Novel by Pam Hillman is the third entry in the series about three Irish immigrant brothers in 1792 Mississippi. This book focuses on Caleb O’Shea as he reunites with his brothers and meets the lovely Alanah Adams. The three brothers are fighting for their homes and their families. Will Caleb continue to search the world for adventure, or will he choose to stay closer to home?

A couple of new cozy mysteries featuring County Cork are now available. *Murder in an Irish Pub* by Carlene O’Connor finds a poker player hanging from the rafters of the local pub. Restaurant owner Siobhan O’Sullivan suspects murder, but she has to watch her step to stay out of the killer’s game. Sheila Connolly offers *The Lost Traveler: A County Cork Mystery* in which Maura Donovan finally has her pub, Sullivan’s, making a profit. Then a body is discovered in the ravine nearby with his face battered beyond recognition. Even after he has been identified, no one claims to know him. Maura must dig into the old secrets of the town to solve the crime.


