David and Donna exemplify a lifetime of dedication to family, service, and community. For more than five decades, they have built a life rooted in love, commitment, and an unwavering belief in giving back.

David Baioni was born in the spring of 1949 on Cleveland's near west side to Helen and Guerino Baioni. He attended St. Rocco's Elementary School and West Tech High School before proudly serving in the United States Army. After his military service, David began a lengthy career in the Cleveland steel mills, where his strong work ethic carried him through decades of demanding labor until his well-earned retirement.

Donna Baioni was born in March of 1950 at Euclid General Hospital to Marion (Pat) and Benjamin Wilbraham. She grew up on Westport Avenue and attended Euclid City Schools. In 1973, she married David, beginning their partnership of over 53 years.

David and Donna have three children David (Kim), Phillip (Lynn), and Katie (Dave). As parents they were deeply involved in family life. David was a constant presence, participating in YMCA Indian Guides and Indian Princesses and supporting his children's many activities. Donna became known as the person who never said "no" when help was needed. She devoted countless hours to Euclid schools as PTA president, classroom supporter, and long-time book fair volunteer. Her service expanded into a professional role supporting elementary school technology programs, while her creativity shone through years of costume design for Euclid's "Big Show" and show choir programs—earning her the lasting nickname "Momma B."

In retirement, David and Donna remain devoted servants of the Euclid community through their long-standing involvement with the Euclid Historical Society. As board members and volunteers, they work to preserve the city's history, stories, and heritage for future generations. Donna's lifelong compassion and leadership were recently recognized with the Euclid Schools Alumni Association Joseph P. Mayer Community

Engagement Award.

Their commitment to faith and service was equally strong at St. Felicitas Church. David and Donna supported numerous parish ministries, most notably the bocce league, which they led for many years and consistently stepped in wherever help was needed. Through church, the Baionis formed lasting friendships that led them to the Irish American Club East Side, where their love of community continues to flourish.

At our General Membership Meetings David and Donna are the first people you see when you walk through the door. They will be selling the 50/50 raffle tickets each month as they have done for years with a friendly smile.

Dave co-chaired the pinochle league with his friend Bud Epic for many years and then took on chairing the league when Bud passed. Donna is a member of the award-winning float committee where she continues to share her talents in decorating the float and making costumes to be worn by participants on the float. Donna also works on the bereavement committee and has helped decorate the club for many events/ seasons,

More than anything else, David and Donna are guided by one clear priority: their five grandchildren. Victoria, Anthony, Nick, Grace, and Stella. Everything they do is grounded in love with family and a desire to build a meaningful legacy for the next generation.

Book Buzz

Bonnie Easton

Several prominent authors recently published new books. Mystery writer Tana French (*The Searcher*, *The Hunter*) is coming out with the third entry of her Cal Hooper trilogy, *The Keeper*. Rachel Holohan of the small remote village of Ardnakelty is about to be engaged to the son of a prominent citizen, but her body is found in the river. Cal Hooper is a retired Chicago cop living in the town and helps in the investigation. Her death may be the result of a family feud or a power struggle, but the whole town feels threatened by the young woman's death.

The sequel to *My Father's House* of Joseph O'Connor's *Rome Escape Line* series was released in early 2025. The setting for this series is the German occupation of Rome in World War II with the Gestapo's reign of terror over Italian citizens. O'Connor's novels are based on the real-life story of Irish Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty who aided diplomats, refugees, and escaped Allied prisoners to flee the city. In the sequel, *The Ghosts of Rome*, an unidentified airman falls from the sky. The Roman underground railroad must continue to function and save more lives, but the operation is threatened by SS Commander Paul Hauptmann. His worthy adversary in the Italian Resistance is Contessa Giovanna Landini. There is no info yet for the release date of the final entry of the trilogy.

Australian author Charlotte McConaghy's newest novel is *Wild Dark Shore*. Widower Dominic Salt and his three children are caretakers of Shearwater Island with its seals, penguins, and the world's largest seedbank. One of Salt's daughters discovers a woman who washed up on shore, and the family nurses her back to health. There is distrust at first, but Rowan jumps in to help preserve the precious seeds and the island's nature biosphere. Love blooms between the widower and the castaway. The island has its own mysteries and unravels them to the human inhabitants slowly.

Do opposites really attract? Author Sarah Griunder Riuz tests the theory in *Last Call at the Local*. When an American singer/songwriter and medical school dropout with ADHD meets Cobh pub owner Jack Dunne, she tells him what he is doing wrong in running his business. Jack has OCD and is grieving the recent death of his father. Chemistry sparks as the author guides them through their mental health issues. This is not your typical boy-meets-girl romance.

Cecilia Ahern (*PS, I Love You*) veteran author of 21 books, released a new book this summer. In *Paper Heart*, 32-year-

old Pip was an unwed mother at the age of 16 and allowed her daughter to be raised by her domineering, narcissistic mother. Pip escaped from her troubles by disappearing into a world of origami figures and poetry until she meets a Dutch astronomer who shows her a larger world, and she begins to turn her life around.

For readers of biographies and Irish history, there is *Great Irish Wives: Remarkable Lives from History* by Nicola Pierce. The book covers the wives of famous Irishmen and how they contributed to their husbands' success: Wolfe Tone, Daniel O'Connell, Oscar Wilde, George Bernard Shaw, Ernest Shackleton, and Eamon De Valera, among others. Today, the men are household names, but their wives were their muses and their champions. Each woman was remarkable in her own way and has her own story to tell.
